
NFM Land Plan: Review

We have provided information on the key plan elements, by section over the last 3 weeks. They have been:

Element	Description
Front Hedge	The front privet hedge currently serves as a visual and physical barrier to the property. The current plan calls for reducing the height of the hedge to 4' to maintain the physical barrier, but create a more welcoming feel
Walkways	The plan introduces level pathways from the gated corners on Court Street to the drivway
Trees and Shrubs	The plan adds additional trees and shrubs (indicted in a reddish color on the plan). Clustering them along the drive will reduce parking on the grass. Adding more young trees throughout will help maintain the canopy as our older trees are removed due to natural aging or safety issues.
Peace Garden	The Peace Garden and Peace pole are relocated to the front. A low bed of native perennials and bulbs will surround the pole.
Patio or Deck from Gathering Room exit	The plan includes space for a deck or patio accessible from the door in the Gathering Room, with a connecting pathway or ramp to the back porch.
Playground	The playground will be left as is. Changes can be considered when it needs to be replaced.
Amphitheater	In response to a request for an outside gathering area, the plan includes an amphitheater made of stone blocks, dug into the required slope of the retention basin.
Fencing	The privacy planting contemplated for the current fencing is native vines running along the fence separating Meeting property from single dwelling neighbors.
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Following, you will see the full plan with a very rough outline (blue) indicating the space for the west parking area which was held aside for consideration in the future as warranted.



When we gather together to discuss the landscape plan are primary interest is ELEMENTS IN THE CURRENT PLAN TO BE RETAINED IN THE FINAL PLAN for detailed design and costing. We will not be discussing parking lots or materials for the plan elements.
